#### Free city map

In the Tourist Information of Lutherstadt Eisleben and Mansfeld e.V. and in the town hall of Lutherstadt Eisleben you will get the current city map to the topic: Explore Eisleben accessibly.

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#### **Church of Saints Peter and Paul**

The Late-Gothic hall church is mainly notable for the fact that Martin Luther was baptized there on November 11, 1483. Redesigned as a "center for baptism," the church receives its visitors with an impressive total-immersion font.

- Narrow main door can be enlarged by arrangement with the church staff
- Interior accessible at ground level



### The house of Luther's birth

The building complex won the state of Saxony-Anhalt's architecture prize in 2007. A permanent exhibition relates Luther's early years.

- Accessible entrance
- Some inner rooms are accessible
- External guests can also use the accessible toilet for Euro 0.50



#### **Tourist information**

The tourist information center is opposite the house of Luther's birth and doubles as the visitor-information center for Lutherstadt Eisleben.

- Accessible entrance



### Ohrenweide/whispering garden

The "Ohrenweide," a renaturation space with a whispering garden comprising footbridges and eared willows, has a Lutheran theme. Texts and quotations by the Reformer are whispered from installed ear trumpets.

- Footbridges and ear trumpets are only partially accessible for disabled visitors



#### Market place with Luther memorial

Since 1883, the Luther memorial has stood almost on the exact site where the municipal court was held "under the linden tree" in the Middle Ages.

- Ground-level access via a lowered curb at the crossing points at the level of the **Luther monument** 



The two-story building with high gables and dormers was constructed in the Late-Gothic style (1519-1531).

- Town-hall premises are not accessible



## St Andrew's Church

St Andrew's Church is the architectural centerpiece of the historic Old Town. Martin Luther delivered his last four sermons from the chancel.

- The church has limited access for disabled visitors
- The interior is accessible by a side door and via a mobile ramp by arrangement, tel. +49 3475 602229



#### The house of Luther's death The museum has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1996.

- Alternative accessible entrance via curate's garden
- Some inner rooms are accessible
- External guests can also use the toilet for Euro 0.50



# Curate's garden

The former garden of the now-ruined old curate's house was developed into a public open space as part of the new museum quarter.

- Accessible path via the side streets (Sperlingsberg and/or Vikariatsgasse), which are only partially accessible to disabled visitors



#### St Anne's Church and Monastery

St Anne's is one of the most beautiful Renaissance churches in Germany. Established in 1515, the Augustinian hermitage with its five Old-Franconian monks'-chamber gables was adjoined to the church.

- Limited access for disabled visitors
- The interior is accessible by a side door and via a mobile ramp by arrangement, tel. +49 3475 604115
- Accessible toilet in the inner courtyard



Hotel and Restaurant Mansfelder Hof

- Accessible in the rear courtvard via a steep ramp
- Restaurant and an accessible room with a partly accessible toilet
